

From Fr. Brendan's Desk

Memorial Day

On Monday, we honor all of our brave women and men who have died in the service of our nation. As Christians, we are called to pray for their souls in a special way on this day. We remember those who, to quote Abraham Lincoln, "Gave their lives that this nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this." Yet, as soaring as our rhetoric can often be, I think that we forget just what a sacrifice people have made when they died in the service. Ronald Reagan once said, "The imagination plays a trick. We see our soldiers in our mind as old and wise. We see them as something like the Founding Fathers, grave and gray-haired. But most of them were boys when they died. They gave up two lives, really -- the one they were living and the one they would have lived. When they died, they gave up their chance to be revered old men. They gave up everything for their country, for us. All we can do is remember."

He makes a great point. It is always tragic when we lose someone and it is even more tragic when one dies before his or her time. I think we forget just how young our soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen are. Many of them are in their teens and early twenties. Even as a (comparatively) young priest, I recognize that I am now twice as old as many of those who have died in the service of our nation. In my parents' house, there is a frame with a bunch of family pictures; me and my brother, my parents, their parents who are my grand-parents, their grandparents, and various aunts, uncles and cousins through the years. There is one picture, from World War II, of a skinny young airman, a kid really, in his uniform. It's my great-uncle Bill. I never met Uncle Bill, neither did my dad or his siblings. He died at the age of 19 in the skies over Italy, one more victim of war.

As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to pray for peace and to work for peace. All too often, we forget that the price of a nation's refusal to cooperate with others is paid by the blood of our youth. Our young people lose their lives, and others lose a dear child, a sweetheart, or a parent. There are, sadly, reasons why nations must sometimes take up arms, but war is, ultimately, a failure on the part of some leaders and nations. We, as disciples of Christ, must pray for peace and work for peace. When the drums of war sound, we must remember that those on the other side are God's children as well and that we, as a world, suffer. Let us pray for peace and pray for all of the victims of war.

Readings for the Ascension of the Lord - May 29, 2022

Reading I Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

Reading II Eph 1:17-23

Brothers and sisters:

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe, in accord with the exercise of his great might: which he worked in Christ, raising him from the dead and seating him at his right hand in the heavens, far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion, and every name that is named not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way.

Gospel Lk 24:46-53

Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven. They did him homage and then returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God.

Fr. Scott Donahue Celebrates 40 Years of Priestly Ministry and 25 Years at St. Robert Bellarmine Parish

Please join me as I celebrate my 40th Anniversary of the Priesthood, and 25 years at St. Robert Bellarmine on Sunday, June 12th for the 10:00 am Mass.

I simply want to take the opportunity to celebrate Eucharist with all of you at St. Roberts. The very word Eucharist means Gratitude and Thanksgiving and I am so very grateful for having the privilege to be a priest at St. Roberts.

I was ordained on May 12th, 1982, at Mundelein Seminary. My first assignment was St. Barnabas Parish on the Southside. During that time, I served as the Vice-Chairman of the Association of Chicago Priests. Also, during my time at St. Barnabas, Cardinal Bernardin appointed me Vocation Director of the Archdiocese of Chicago. A position that I served in for 10 years while remaining a Resident Priest at St. Barnabas and St. Juliana Parishes.

In 1996, I became the Associate President of Mercy Home for Boys & Girls and was invited to live at St. Robert Bellarmine Parish by Fr. Michael Georgen. I have been a Resident Priest at the Parish ever since. The choice to live in a parish while serving as Vocation Director and being the President of Mercy Home for Boys & Girls has always been my choice.

I believe that a Diocesan Priest needs to be invested in a parish community to celebrate the Sacraments and preach the Gospel. I love being involved in the life of St. Robert Bellarmine Parish. Over the years I have Baptized your children, celebrated marriages, and anointed the sick.


I have celebrated daily, and weekend Masses, and I have had the privilege of celebrating the

A Letter of Farewell

You may recall that I was hired by Fr. Neil Fackler. Given his incredible penchant for numbers and accounting, he might have my exact number of masses written down – possibly on a green and white account's chart. Joking aside, I have provided music for Masses at St. Robert Bellarmine Church since September 2013. I am sincerely grateful to Fr. Neil for offering me employment and supporting me during his years as Pastor.

Although change is often necessary, the news of change isn't always easy to receive or accept. I am writing to share my news: I decided to change my employment and step down from the Director of Music Ministry position at our church.

In a previous bulletin article, I mentioned that I am a Master's degree student. Fall, 2020 was my first time back at college after a break of nearly twenty years since my last degree. This semester I continued my piano studies. All the university piano students performed in two recitals of music by African-American composers. This was part of a year-long program started by our professor, known as *Keys to Inclusion*. I learned music by Margaret Bonds, a Chicago composer of the 1900s. Also, I studied George Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*, and music of Franz Schubert. There is one music history class remaining and a lecture-recital for my thesis; I hope to finish my degree this fall. A profound Thank -you goes to my piano professors, Dr. Susan Tang and Dr. Kay Kim!

Wrapping-up studies for my Master's Degree led me to ponder my future. A friend suggested that I apply for a new opportunity: teaching music for the Chicago Park District. I felt honored to be offered this position! I will be working at Horner Park, Sauganash Park, and nearby at Portage Park. This endeavor is very dear to me. My mentor, Mr. Don Sadofsky was the Music Instructor at several parks for over forty years. His influence helped guide my decision to become a music teacher. I hope to valiantly continue Mr. Don's legacy of music in the parks.

I consider it a privilege to lead parishioners in sung prayer during our liturgies – at my estimate at least 2,400 masses. Furthermore, I want to thank everyone who was involved, in many capacities, for helping me with music ministry! Many thanks go to choir members, school choir children & their parents, cantors, parish staff, priests, my music teachers-mentors. Also, I want to thank all of you, the parishioners of St. Robert, for making your parish a supportive environment! I am humbled when I receive compliments. Sometimes I tend to think "I'm just doing my job", and the kind words people express to me are always appreciated!

St. Robert will remain in my heart. The decision to move on to the park district was not an immediate one – I struggled with the choice of remaining or seeking new musical endeavors. I take with me many beautiful memories from St. Robert! There are people I will miss, including the choir members, the school children, the priests, and Sisters of Notre Dame. Through your generous donations to your church, and with the leadership of earlier pastors, including Fr. Neil, we have much to be proud of. As of 2018 we have two new instruments in church – a very fine grand piano (would anyone miss it if I took it with me?), an organ, a sound system, as well as the facilities in Kernaghan Hall. By the way, in case you want to hear some of the school children's choirs, or the concert we did, please visit the St Robert Bellarmine Music Ministry channel on YouTube.

As St. Robert Bellarmine Church is now part of a new parish, *Mary Undoer of Knots*, I wish our Pastor, Fr. Robert, as well as Fr. Scott Donahue and Frs. Brendan and Frank, all the best during the *Renew My Church* process. Farewell until our paths cross again,
