### **Renew My Church Updates**

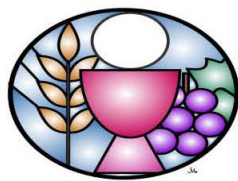
Last July, St. Constance and St. Robert Bellarmine were united under a new parish and this past winter we received the parish name, Mary, Undoer of Knots. The parish staff is currently working to transition from operating as two, independent places to operating as a single parish that has two church sites. Part of that transition is how we present ourselves as a parish. Members of our parish staff are currently working on a bulletin design for the entire parish. Beginning in June, we will be switching to a new, single Mary, Undoer of Knots bulletin instead of the current system of having two separate bulletins for the legacy churches. This bulletin will look different from the one that we are used to, for a variety of reasons. The first is that there has been information that has gone into one bulletin but not the other. Now, all of the information about our parish life will be in a single bulletin.

Also, as many of you are aware, we are a bi-lingual parish. We have ministry in Polish and English. Those of us who are used to St. Robert's bulletin will notice that there are announcements in Polish and English. This is so that everyone can keep abreast of what is happening in our parish. There are also financial considerations. It is less expensive for our parish to have one bulletin than two. This will also help us to conserve natural resources and preserve the environment. Inevitably, of course, there will be mistakes, especially early on. Please feel free to contact either rectory to clarify anything or find answers to any questions that you might have. We realize that change can be off-putting, but this is part of our identity as a new parish.

In July, we hope to have a single website for our unified parish. It will include information about our parish school, St. Robert Bellarmine, as well as our two legacy parishes. There will be information in both English and Polish. As always, please feel free to contact me or anyone else at our parish if you have questions or concerns.

### **Good Shepherd Sunday**

Today is traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday, as Jesus tells us in the Gospel that he is the Good Shepherd. In every age, we need good and holy priests to help us along the road to heaven. I give thanks for the many priests that have helped me in my own journey of faith and I pray that I may do God's work well. Today, in our local church, we know that there are not enough priests. I would like to challenge each and every one of us to pray for good and holy priests and to invite a young man, whom you think would make a good priest, if he has considered the call. Priests do not just magically fall out of the sky. They come from families and parishes that pray for them.

## Readings for the Fourth Sunday of Easter - May 8, 2022

### Reading I

Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia. On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.

On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said. Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth."

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord. All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread through the whole region. The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them, and went to Iconium. The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

### Reading II

Rev 7:9, 14b-17

I, John, had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands.

Then one of the elders said to me, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

"For this reason they stand before God's throne and worship him day and night in his temple. The one who sits on the throne will shelter them. They will not hunger or thirst anymore, nor will the sun or any heat strike them. For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

### Gospel

Jn 10:27-30

Jesus said: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

## ON CONDUITS, GOOD SHEPHERDS, AND MOTHER'S DAY

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I enjoyed Easter Sunday Mass, but probably for all the wrong reasons. I attended the 10:00 AM liturgy at my home parish along with my wife Gail, my daughter Sarah, her husband Eric, and boy child Jack, now eleven months. It was his first Easter, and I was thrilled to have him and the rest all together. I wore a suit, and a bow tie and with a matching pocket square that Sarah and Eric had once given me as a gift. Jack didn't care about the suit or the bow tie, but he loved that pocket square.

Hence, all the wrong reasons... Gail was holding Jack on my left when he reached out and removed the pocket square. I returned it to my suit jacket pocket. It was the first of many such fun exchanges. Later, when Jack got temperamental with Gail, she handed him to me. Well, I'd made the observation days earlier that while Jack enjoys being in my grasp, he enjoys it only when I'm moving. When I'm not, he tends to fuss. As such, I spent much of Mass either passing Jack to Sarah on my right, or passing him back left to Gail. My apologies to the people sitting behind us.

There were no Jack distractions, however, when we'd all gone to the Christian church Eric and Sarah have been attending for a 5:00 PM Good Friday service, as Eric and Sarah put Jack into a nursery where staffers watched over him and other little ones while the service was in session. At Sarah and Eric's later on, we were discussing the differences between Catholicism and Christianity-at-large, and I maintained--as I always do--that the similarities far outweigh the differences.

But Eric surfaced one difference of import: the notion of Catholics praying to Mary. He asked Sarah about this, actually, and Sarah turned it over to me in light of my daily rosary routine. I told Eric that the rosary is a Scripture-based prayer calling to mind the biblical stories he knows well such as the Annunciation, the Agony in the Garden, the Resurrection, etc. And I told him that Catholics do not worship Mary, but we go to her in an intercessory fashion, that she might bring us closer to Jesus.

Acknowledging the bad analogy upfront, I told Eric that it would be like a young woman going to Sarah fifteen years from now to ask her help in getting to know Jack. Mothers just have a way. This Fourth Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday) happens to be Mother's Day as well in 2022. Interesting, in a circuitous way. In today's Gospel, Jesus says "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me...My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all." Then, at the Last Supper: "No one comes to the Father except through me." OK...

Per an online dictionary site, one definition of conduit is "a person or country that links two or more other people." By his own words, Jesus is a conduit between all of us and the Father. I was totally a conduit at Easter Sunday Mass between Jack's mom and his nonnie, and both had a touch with the boy child that I couldn't touch. And while Catholics do not worship Mary, we recognize her as the mother of God, a conduit to the Christ, and worthy by extension of our devotion. I enjoyed Easter Sunday Mass, but probably for all the wrong reasons. Which, upon reflection, may have been all the right reasons... Happy Good Shepherd Sunday. And, Mother's Day!
