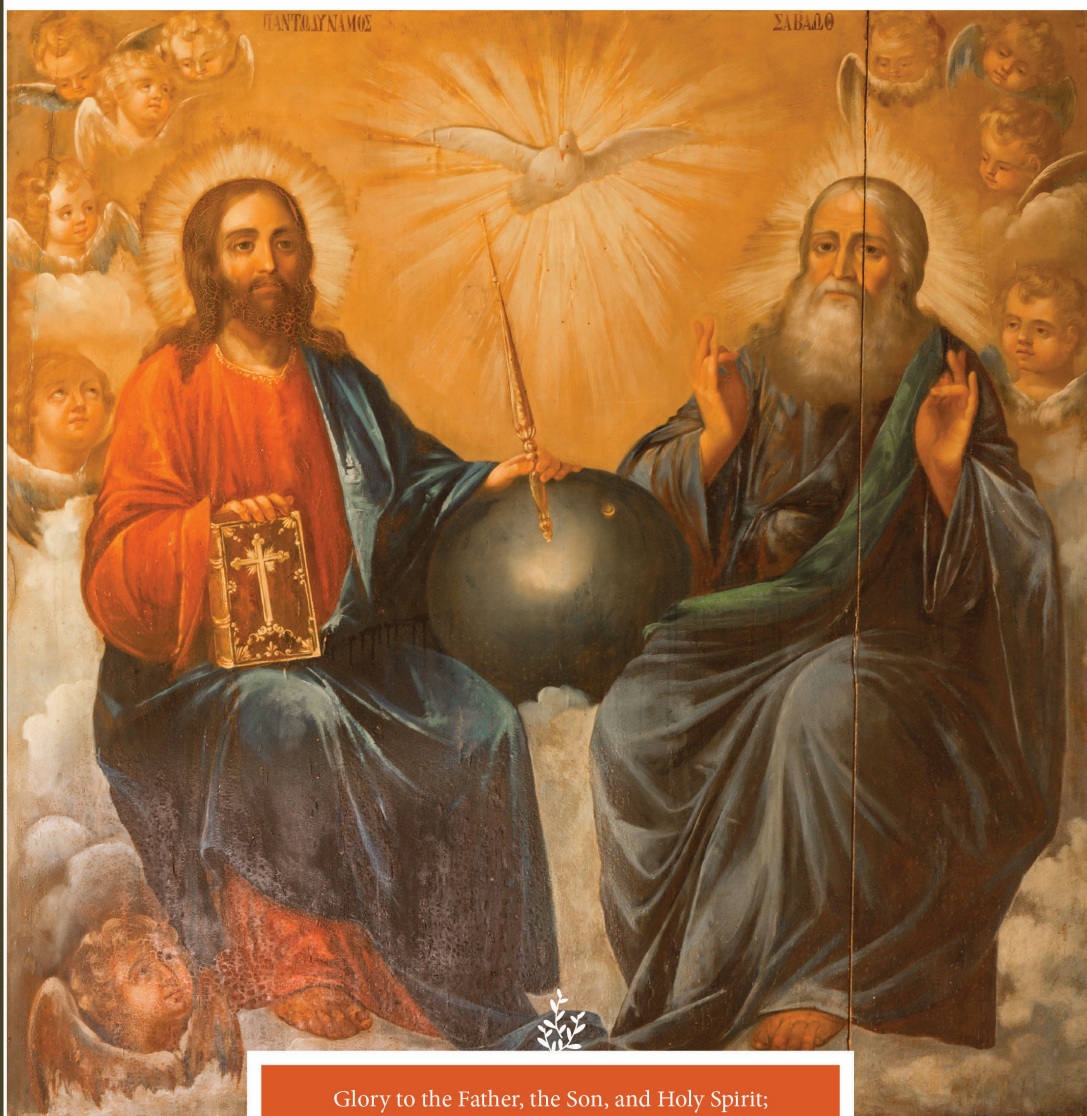

From Fr. Brendan's Desk**God is Love**

Saint John famously describes God as love, writing, "We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us. God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him" (1 Jn 4:16). I think that this is the best explanation of the great mystery that we celebrate as a Church today, the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity is, I would maintain, always one of the most difficult things for us as Christians to understand. In fact, we really can't comprehend it. We worship one God who is a trinity of three persons, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. They are all fully God and yet are distinct persons. It's enough to give you a headache. Actually, in the theology class where we discussed this mystery, we seminarians frequently left with headaches! That's how it goes sometimes. Yet, Fr. Barron would continually take us back to this passage from St. John's first letter, that God is love. He showed us how, in the writings of the great theologians of the Church, this was ultimately the way that we as human beings come to understand the trinity. We understand God as love.

This does not just mean that God is loving. God is loving, in that God does indeed do acts of love, no one would argue that. But God is more than just loving, God *is* love itself. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are each one God. God is, then, a Trinity of persons. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are so intimately connected that we cannot imagine one without the other two. They are distinct, but they belong together. Saint Augustine describes the Trinity by comparing it to a relationship. He says that the Father is like a lover, the Son is like the beloved and the Holy Spirit is the love between the two. In doing so, St. Augustine shows us just that God is not just loving, but God's very nature is love itself. So, what does this mean for us?

Well, quite a lot, really. St. John Paul II famously described human families as the best possible way to imagine the Trinity. Like any analogy it is, of course, imperfect, but it guides our understanding. In a family we see the love of a father and a mother bringing children into the world. And, as he articulates this analogy, St. John Paul II reminds us that we are to live out our family lives to show the image of the Trinity. We must conduct our family lives and our relationships with others so that people can see in our lives an image of the love of the Holy Trinity. After all, in the very beginning of the scriptures, we are reminded that we are made in God's image and likeness. (Gn 1:27).

This also can help us to see our role in our parish and in the world around us. We are called to see others as equal to ourselves. The other person that we see is made in God's image as well. That other person is someone whom God loves. Likewise, we are also called to remember that we need others, that we depend on others and that others depend on us. The poet John Donne once wrote, "No man is an island." Indeed, we need others, and God has made us to need others both so that we can be reminded of our need for God and to imitate the love of God in the world.

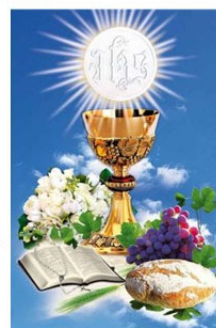

I believe that a Diocesan Priest needs to be invested in a parish community to celebrate the Sacraments and preach the Gospel. I love being involved in the life of St. Robert Bellarmine Parish. Over the years I have Baptized your children, celebrated marriages, and anointed the sick.

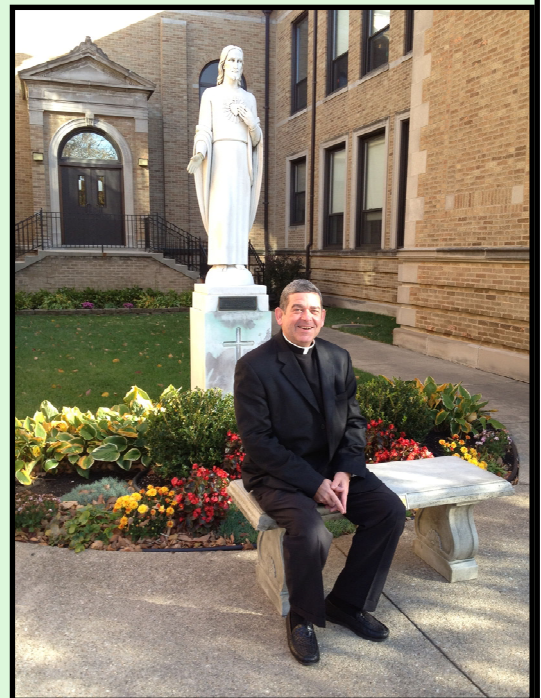

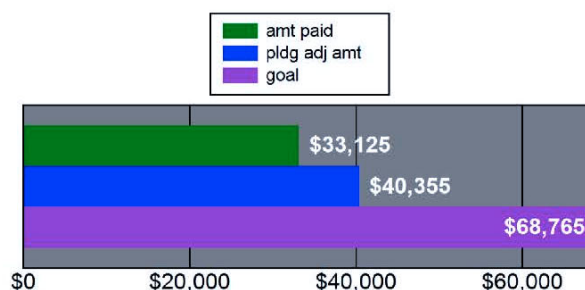

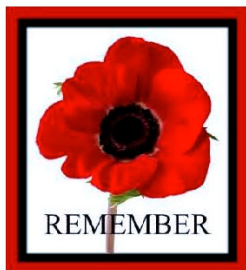

ON MAKING LIGHT OF THE TRINITY (I'M JOKING...)

Welcome to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, a high-ranking feast on the Church calendar that celebrates not so much an event (like last week's Pentecost commemoration) as a doctrine. And a confusing doctrine, at that. Which reminds me of a cartoon I saw once. Two little kids wearing backpacks are walking side-by-side. One says to the other, "Dad took so long trying to explain the Trinity, I didn't have the heart to ask him about the Electoral College." Not crazy funny, but funny.

I wrote in this space last August that were I a priest, I'd have a hard time preaching about the Church's doctrine of Mary being assumed into heaven "...because I'd be unable to point to anything scriptural in describing the Assumption." The same holds true for the Holy Trinity. I've checked and double-checked, and the Holy Trinity per se is just not in there. Which is not to say that there aren't plenty of Scriptural references to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

We get a couple of them today. The second reading points to the Trinity even though the Church's doctrine defining it didn't hit until the First Councils of Nicaea and (later) Constantinople three hundred-some years after Paul wrote to the Romans. Per the Apostle, "...Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Also, "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." No mention of God as Father, but still God as God, and Jesus, and the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel also speaks Trinity without saying the word. Per Jesus to his friends, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine..." Father, Father's Son, and Spirit.

What does the Catechism say? "We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal. Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity..." Huh? Yeah. Confusing.

OK. I already told you about those two little kids with the backpacks talking Trinity. Now let me tell you about the bishop quizzing some older kids before their Confirmation. The bishop asks for someone in the crowd to define the Trinity. Nobody volunteers so the bishop singles out one young person, who mumbles a response. The bishop says, "I'm sorry, but I didn't understand that." The kid mumbles louder (but not much louder), "Father, Son, Holy Spirit." The bishop says, "I'm sorry, but I still didn't understand." And that's when the confirmandi replies, "You're not supposed to. It's a mystery." Works for me.
